

Meet the Choreographers

Jenna Davis | Choreographer

Jenna Davis (she/her) is a Dallas based movement artist. She is currently in her final year at SMU Meadows School of the Arts, where she is pursuing a B.F.A. in Dance Performance as well as a B.A. in Film and Media Arts. She has performed as a company artist with Bridget Moore's B.Moore Dance, including at the Joyce Theatre in New York, in January of 2023. She has shared space with Sidra Bell, Mike Esperanza, Madison Hicks, Kevin Pajarillaga, Joshua L. Peugh, and Maleek Washington through different workshops across the nation. She has trained internationally in Moncalvo and Lucca Italy, Berlin, Germany, and Tel Aviv, Israel. She is also a movement photographer and videographer who has had work featured in major programming such as Edinburgh Festival Fringe and American Dance Platform at the Joyce.



Ryan Jaffe | Choreographer

Born and raised in South Florida, Ryan had the opportunity to attend Bak Middle School of the Arts and A.W. Dreyfoos High School of the Arts. He trained in many styles during middle and high school, including ballet, modern, jazz, contemporary, and hip-hop. Throughout his career thus far, Ryan has been able to perform the works of choreographers such as Jennifer Archibald, Joy Bollinger, Silas Farley, Adam Houghland, Darrell Grand Moultrie, and Matthew Neenan. He has spent many summer and winter breaks training at institutions such as Jacob's Pillow School, Martha Graham School, BalletX, and Bruce Wood Dance. As a choreographer, Ryan has received multiple choreography awards at dance competitions in the South Florida area and an honorable mention for NDEO's Artistic Merit, Leadership, and Academic Achievement Award. In addition to performing and choreographing, Ryan has volunteered and shadowed at Neurosport Physical Therapy and Westside Dance Physical Therapy, where he worked with and learned from leaders in the performing arts and dance medicine. Ryan is continuing his studies at Southern Methodist University, majoring in dance performance and applied physiology and health management.



Stephen "Stevo" McMaryion | Choreographer

Born and raised in West Texas, Stephen McMaryion loved the arts growing up and pursued his passion for ballet and modern dance at West Texas A&M University. During his undergraduate years, Stevo booked his first professional opportunity with singer Carrie Underwood for her five-month "Some Hearts Tour." After the tour's conclusion, Stevo was accepted into the Edge Performing Arts School in Los Angeles, California to continue his professional career and education. Stevo resides in Dallas, Texas, and is the founder and director of the Live Arts Conservatory and a professional dance company, Urban Performing Company. He has danced and choreographed with many companies and teams in Dallas such as Dallas Cowboy Cheerleaders, Southern Methodist University, DCR&B, 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre, and many more!



Jarvis McKinley | Choreographer & Artistic Development Coach

Jarvis McKinley is from Hattiesburg, Mississippi, and began his dance training at the age of 6 at the Dance Place and Pine Belt Youth Ballet. McKinley's dance education continued at the Virginia School of the Arts where he was granted a full four-year scholarship for his high school education. In addition, McKinley received a full scholarship from the National Dance Institute Dance Program in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Under the direction of Jacques d'Amboise, McKinley was awarded a full four-year scholarship and received his (AA) Certificate in Dance at the New World School of the Arts. McKinley has trained at numerous academies and programs throughout his professional career including the Kirov Ballet Academy, Jacobs Pillow, Bates Dance Festival, and the Ailey School.

In 2008, McKinley joined Alvin Ailey II and later became a soloist at Armitage Gone Dance in 2010. Throughout his professional career, McKinley has performed with Complexions Contemporary Ballet under the direction of Dwight Rhoden and Desmond Richardson as well as performed works by the following choreographers: Alvin Ailey, William Forsythe, Robert Battle, Judith Jamison, Christopher L. Huggins, and Francesca Harper. McKinley's other notable achievements include traveling and performing in the Tony Award-Winning Broadway musicals Memphis and Flashdance in collaboration with choreographer Sergio Trujillo, and dancing with some of the music industry's best artists including Usher Raymond, Jojo, KiCi & Jojo, and The Dream. In addition, McKinley was awarded the Margaret Fonteyn Award by his Ballet Master, Petrus Boseman. Jarvis McKinley joined 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre in the role of Artistic Development Coach in the spring of 2022.



Zach Law Ingram | Choreographer & Artistic Director

Zach Law Ingram is from Miami, Florida, and graduated from the New World School of the Arts in New York City. During his formative years of dance training, Ingram attended the Dance Theatre of Harlem, Miami City Ballet, and The Ailey School in New York City. Ingram started his professional career with Alvin Ailey's Second Company (Ailey II) and later became a founding member of Space T.U. Embrace project. Ingram has received numerous choreographic and artistic awards including the National Foundation for the Advancement in the Arts (NFAA) Gold medalist and the U.S. Presidential Scholar in the Arts.

Over the course of Ingram's professional performative career, he has danced with the following companies: Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Armitage Gone!, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, Lion King Las Vegas, Lion King on Broadway, and Walt Disney World's Festival of the Lion King. In addition, he has collaborated with and performed works by Alvin Ailey, Dwight Rhoden, Alonzo King, Martha Graham, Judith Jamison, Twyla Tharp, Karole Armitage, Earl Mosley, Troy Powell, and Peter London.

As a dancer, choreographer, and teacher, Ingram strives to innovate the boundaries of traditional dance techniques by merging the strengths and dimensions of classical ballet and contemporary movement. Ingram has set works on Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, Lion King Las Vegas, Ballet Noir, Dance Black Dance Theatre II, and numerous dance studios nationwide. As of 2014, he has toured and performed in Tokyo, Paris, London, Scotland, Freeport, Singapore, Beijing, Shanghai, St. Petersburg, Milan, and the United States.

Ingram is currently based in the Dallas region. In 2014, Ingram co-founded 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre with Marielle McGregor to produce innovative and unique contemporary ballet at elite levels of artistic excellence. In addition, he is on faculty as part of Southern Methodist University.

Madi Grace Albert | Costume Manager & Dancer

Madi Grace Albert from Potosi, Texas began dancing at the age of two training in various disciplines at Abilene Ballet Theatre. During this time, she studied with Mauro Villanueva and Kenny Borchard of Joffrey Ballet Texas and spent her summers at Texas Ballet Theatre. She graduated Magna Cum Laude in May of 2022 with a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Ballet and Modern Dance from the School for Classical & Contemporary Dance at Texas Christian University.

While at TCU, she was in works by Francisco Aviña, José Limón, Adam McKinney, Kara Wilkes, and Francesca Harper. Along with her BFA, Madi Grace received a Pilates Teacher Training Certificate and earned the Dean's Academic Excellence Award. Simultaneously, she volunteered at Cook Children's in Child Life and worked as a Costume Supervisor for Hip Pocket Theatre. Madi Grace also was the Director of Community Engagement for the Alpha chapter of Chi Tau Epsilon Dance Honor Society. Madi Grace joined 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre as a Dancer in September 2022 and fulfilled the role of Costume Manager in January 2023. Outside of dance, she is a personal assistant and teaches Pilates, Dance, and Barre. Madi Grace's love for movement stretches beyond just dance and exercise. Madi Grace works with individuals weekly through Adaptive and Adult dance at the Studio of MoveMINT to create an atmosphere where every human can approach moving the body as holistic healing and physical growth.

Katherine Cornell | Website Manager & Dancer

Katherine Cornell is from Dallas, Texas, and graduated with honors from The University of Texas at Austin with a B.F.A. in Dance and B.B.A. in Management Information Systems in December 2021. At UT Austin, Katherine was in the Omega Chapter of Alpha Phi Sorority and she is currently the Co-Chair of Philanthropy for the Alpha Phi Dallas and Suburban Community Alumnae Chapter. For her full-time job, Katherine works at Charles Schwab Headquarters in Enterprise Operational Risk Management. Since the age of three, Katherine has trained in ballet, jazz, modern, and contemporary dance techniques. In addition to dance, Katherine studied the piano and violin for nine years.

Katherine's love and passion for dance started at an early age training at local Dallas dance studios including Dallas Metropolitan Ballet, Dallas Ballet Center, Powerhouse of Dance, Highland Park Dance, Next Step Dance, Dallas Black Dance Theatre, and Ballet Academy of Texas. In her formative years of dance education, Katherine had the privilege of working with various choreographers and training at the following professional dance companies: American Ballet Theatre, New York City Ballet, Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, Ballet West, Sidra Bell New York, and the Dutch National Ballet in Amsterdam.

At UT Austin, Katherine participated in three years of Fundamental Projects in Dance Performance and Repertoire, which provided opportunities to collaborate with outside choreographers and in-house faculty in preparation for main-stage productions throughout the fall and spring academic semesters. Katherine was selected to work with the following notable choreographers: dancer and choreographic fellow Rena Butler of Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, Bridget Moore of B.Moore.Dance, Juilliard graduate and choreographer Madison Hicks, and former soloist Kirven Douthit-Boyd of Alvin Ailey for week-long artistic residencies. Katherine joined 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre as the company's Website Manager and as a Dancer in December 2022.

Catherine Fletcher | Dancer

Catherine (Sexton) Fletcher began her dance training at Suzanne's School of Dance in College Station, Texas. She performed with the school's company and Ballet Brazos under the instruction of Katy Ellison. She also trained in intensives with Project Dance New York and Houston, Ballet West, Ballet Austin, and Texas Ballet Theater.

Catherine continued her training at Texas Christian University in the School of Classical and Contemporary Dance where she graduated Magna Cum Laude double majoring in Ballet Performance and Modern Dance. At TCU she also earned a Pilates Teaching Certificate with distinction and served as Director of National Business for the Alpha chapter of Chi Tau Epsilon Dance Honor Society. A Nordan Fine Arts Scholar, highlights in the SCCD include performances by resident faculty Nina Martin and Susan Douglas Roberts, and works by guest artists LeeWei Chao and Summer Lee Rhatigan. Catherine completed an internship and performed with Ballet West ArtEmotion coached by Colby Damon, Allison DeBona, and Rex Tilton in the summer of 2018. While pausing her collegiate career to recover from an injury in April 2019, Catherine taught master classes in the College Station area, directed rehearsals for Ballet Brazos, and earned certification as a 200hr Registered Yoga Teacher. Upon returning to TCU, she performed in works by guest artists Kurt Douglas and Suzanne Haag as well as premiered her own choreography.

Catherine joined 6 o'Clock Dance Theater as a Company Dancer in July 2022 after performing with Zion Dance Project under the direction of Vincent Hardy for a year contract. In addition to rehearsing and performing with 6DT in 2023, Catherine performed the premiere of Nightmare Before Nutcracker under direction of Brianna Moriarty and the Tchaikovsky Suite Spectacular under the coaching of Christa Beacham. She continues to instruct dance, pilates, and yoga in the Dallas/Fort Worth area.

Abby Gluckman | Rehearsal Director & Dancer

Abby Gluckman is a Dallas, Texas native and graduated magna cum laude from Tulane University with a B.F.A. in Dance and a B.S. in Mathematics. In May 2023, Abby graduated with a Master of Arts in Teaching in Mathematics Education from the University of Texas at Dallas. In December 2023, Abby will obtain a Texas teacher certificate in 7-12 Mathematics. Abby grew up dancing at Texas Ballet Theater School, Dallas before furthering her dance education at the collegiate level at Tulane University. While at Tulane, Abby was a four-year member of the Newcomb Dance Company and had the opportunity to work with guest artists Omar Carrum, Kathryn "Kitty" Daniels, and Jim Lepore. In May 2021, Abby was awarded the Jill Karp Prize for Dance: Choreography and Performance and the Minnette L. Starts Award for Excellence in Dance by the Newcomb Department of Theatre and Dance faculty.

Abby has also trained at the Bates Dance Festival and performed as a guest with 6 O'Clock Dance Theatre in 2017. Over the course of her dance journey, Abby has built a strong ballet background, discovered a passion for modern and contemporary dance, and started to develop her choreographic voice. Currently, Abby is clinical teaching high school mathematics full time in order to obtain her Texas teacher certificate. In addition to teaching math, Abby teaches dance and co-runs the Performance and Competitive Ensemble program at Texas Ballet Theater School, Dallas. Abby joined 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre as an Apprentice in July 2021, was promoted to Company Member in May 2022, and fulfilled the role of Rehearsal Director in August 2023.

Whittnee Hollis | Dancer

Whittnee Hollis was born and raised in Dallas, Texas. She began training at three years old at a small competitive studio, attended the Prodigy Dance and Performing Arts Center in her teenage years, and spent the summers dancing at the Debbie Allen Dance Institute in Fort Worth, Texas. After years of fostering a love of dance and strong technique, she was awarded a full scholarship to Brockus Conservatory, a boarding arts high school in Redlands, California, but instead chose to remain in Dallas to attend the prestigious arts magnet, Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts. In May 2020, she graduated with a B.F.A. in Dance from Sam Houston State University. During her collegiate years, Whittnee gained her certification in Pilates Mat and Reformer through Balanced Body and hopes to eventually pursue a career focused on dancer post-performance rehabilitation. In addition, she assisted at the Jump Dance Convention for Bobby Newberry and attended many dance summer intensives.

In 2018, she attended Dance Italia in Lucca, Italy, which is a 6-week summer program enriched with the local Italian culture, and had the opportunity to attend NW Dance Projects SDI in Portland, Oregon under the direction of Sarah Slipper. In 2021 she had the opportunity to dance with the Urban Performing Company under the direction of Stephen "Stevo" McMariyon. While rehabilitating an injury, she began to set her sights on plans to pursue a graduate degree in Dance Movement in Psychotherapy post-performance. She hopes to utilize her graduate degree training to help dancers, athletes, and families heal their bodies and minds through movement. Whittnee joined the company as a Dancer in September of 2023 and is excited to explore her movement potential and growth as an artist in working with 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre.

RJ Hooks | Dancer

Robert Hooks II a.k.a. RJ is a young upcoming artist born and raised in Brooklyn, New York. RJ started dancing at three years of age under Deborah Barton, Serina Young, and Ming Dunn. He attended Brooklyn High School of the Arts and studied under Michelle J. Smith and Ian J. Dasilva. Rj, and has trained with artists such as Obediah Wright, Earl Mosley, Thera Ward, Kevin lega Jeff, and many more.

RJ started performing professionally with Jamel Gaines Creative Outlet, TORCH Dance Theatre, and Alpha Omega Theatrical Dance Company. RJ has performed in notable venues such as Carnegie Hall, Bryant Park, and the New Year's Eve Ball Drop in New York. In his free time, RJ enjoys playing football, basketball, and watching animal documentaries. RJ joined 6 o'clock Dance Theatre as a Dancer in October 2023.

Kaley Jensen | Guest Artist

Kaley Jensen is a professional dancer, adjunct professor, educator, pilates instructor, choreographer, and creator of her own mentoring program for dancers: Mindset to Movement. Born and raised in Atlanta, Georgia, she attended Brigham Young University as a dance major and business minor, performing and touring with the Theatre Ballet Company all four years. During this time, she trained on scholarship at the San Francisco Conservatory of Dance and Ballet West and achieved academic and international talent awards at the World Dance Movement in Italy. She went on to pursue her Masters of Fine Arts at the University of Arizona, where she met her now husband and deepened her passion for performing, educating, and choreographing. After her first year, she was in a severe automobile accident where she broke her back but was able to recover and work her way back to dancing through a dedicated pilates regimen—which quickly became a passion.

Since moving to Dallas in 2017, Kaley completed her pilates training and has enjoyed teaching and choreographing locally for studios and dance departments such as Richland College and most recently Collin College, to the national AGO conference for two years. She has danced professionally with companies such as Bruce Wood Dance, Zion Dance Project, Ballet North Texas, Collin County Ballet Theatre, Ballet Dallas, and most recently, Full Circle Dance. Professional highlights include performing a lead in an original work by Silas Farley of New York City Ballet, Dew Drop and Sugar Plum Fairy in The Nutcracker, as well as the principal role of Phoenix in Phoenix Rising, by Zach Ingram of 6 o'Clock Dance Theatre.

Since the birth of her son, Kaley continues to perform, educate and mentor. He went on to study ballet and jazz dance performance at Point Park University in Pittsburgh, PA. Alex has also danced as a company member with Dallas Neo-Classical Ballet, Anita N. Martinez Ballet Folklorico, Ballet Dallas (formerly Contemporary Ballet Dallas), DBDT: Encore (formerly Dallas Black Dance Theatre II), and Bruce Wood Dance.

He has also performed at various industrial events such as the Mary Kay National Seminars, on Holland America and Princess Cruise Lines as a production cast member, in television commercials, and in musical theater productions such as Lyric Stage's production of "Fiddler on the Roof" and Lubbock Moonlight Musicals' production of "Tarzan".
